AS A COMMUNITY-BASED, NOT-FOR-PROFIT, our mission is to provide exceptional compassionate end-of-life care to the community.

Since 1983, our services have expanded to include numerous specialty programs to further enhance the quality of life.

Our **three Hospice Houses** with a total of 40 beds are located throughout the county, as are our **4 Thrift Stores** which help supplement non-reimbursed care.



As a **Level 4 member of We Honor Veterans**, our focus is increasing access for so many who served our country.

We also provided \$476,715 in charitable care in 2019. Over the past 5 years, that figure is \$2,318,870.

The ALOS for 2019 is 46.6 days and our family satisfaction score of 89.4% rating is excellent/very good (= rating a 9 or 10 on a 0-10 point scale); higher than the national average of 85% (HealthCareFirst/2017).

Our volunteers provided 3,175 visits totaling 20,196 hours.

HMC's affiliated companies are Accent Medical (DME/supplies) and Center for Comprehensive Palliative Care.

SPECIALTY PROGRAMS:

- Transitions—306 clients
- Pet Peace of Mind—3 volunteers and 9 pet visitors help care for patients' pets
- 11th Hour Vigil—56 volunteer sitters
- Veterans Pinning Ceremonies—345 in 2019
- Camp Mariposa—a bereavement camp held twice a year for ages 5-12 served 40 youngsters. The Monarch Center for Hope & Healing provided services for a total 1,050 kids.



Community Grief Support

Hospice of Marion County's commitment to provide bereavement services to all in need is a hallmark of its dedication to the community. Outreach includes: adult support groups, Memorial Services, Grief Care seminars, Suicide Survivor Conference, VA Summits, monthly workshops for the public, seminars with the school system, assessment services and community resource coordination and private consultations about Advance Directives.
